Firstly, I just wanted to congratulate you all on the really impressive way you have coped with the disruption to your school life over the last half term. You have been truly outstanding!

Next week is our half term holiday believe it or not! We recognise that you have had a busy and at times stressful half term. As well as all your academic work, we've asked you to start thinking about future plans and UCAS intentions. Because of this, we are asking staff to set only minimal work over the half term holiday, and you should take advantage of this to have a proper rest. It has been a busy and really quite stressful half term since Easter, and your priority for next week should be to have a break from your computer, get outside and have a change of activity, enjoy the sunshine and, of course, stay safe.

If any of you are at a loose end and missing academic activity, you might want to look at some of the supra-curricular activities that Mrs Taylor has already suggested to you. I have put a couple of links at the bottom of this email to interesting and mind-expanding activities – enjoy, or not, as you wish!
